What is the Experiential Learning in Innovation, Technology, and Entrepreneurship (ELITE) Program for Black Youth?

- » Holistic approach for Black Youth to access handson learning and work-integrated training in science, technology, engineering, and mathematics (STEM) fields and entrepreneurship.
- >> For Black Youth between the ages of 15 and 22, enrolled in high school or a post-secondary institution.
- » Interns participate in paid internships in an innovation ecosystem and on cutting-edge industry-relevant equipment.
- » Projects with university researchers, for-profit industry companies, or government agencies.
- » Includes an Entrepreneurship Design Series and a Wellness and Coaching Series.
- » Interns acquire marketable technical skills, transition to post-secondary studies, develop resiliency, and build a professional network for future employment.


The ELITE Program team includes the following staff members.


